Frequently Asked Questions

Is this a guided tour?

No. This is a deviation from the scheduled itinerary, so you will be mostly on your own this day with free time to stroll through the aquarium at your leisure. As the aquarium is located just one block from your hotel, no transfer is necessary. Enrichment Journeys will arrange for a guide or aquarium staff member to speak with you, provide you with your tickets, and ensure that you know how to get to and from the aquarium.

Is lunch included?

No. There is a lovely restaurant at the aquarium, or you may choose to have lunch at one of the many restaurants in town.

Will I receive a refund or credit for choosing to visit the aquarium instead of going snorkeling?

Yes. You will receive a credit of \$35 if you choose to forego the snorkeling (and included lunch) and instead spend the day at the aquarium at your leisure.

O me and my traveling partner need to sign up for the same activity? No. One of you may go snorkeling and the other may visit the aquarium. You will simply meet back up at the hotel at the end of the day.

Is there a deadline for signing up?

Yes. Because Enrichment Journeys purchases tickets for both the snorkeling excursion and aquarium ahead of time, no changes to your reservation can be made after final payment is collected.

What if I want to go snorkeling AND visit the aquarium?

It is not possible to do both in the same day. In order to do both activities, Enrichment Journeys recommends adding the optional extension of 1-night Cairns hotel stay. That will give you an extra day on your own before the Enrichment Journeys program begins, which can be used to visit the aquarium.
